



**THE PODIATRISTS REGULATIONS 1982,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 13th day of February 1989

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to paragraphs (d) and (m) of section 40 (1) of the Medical Auxiliaries Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Podiatrists Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Podiatrists Regulations 1982* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1989.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 9 (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Podiatrists Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the following regulation:

“9. (1) The fee for registration as a podiatrist shall be \$66.

Amendment No. 1: S.R. 1984/83

Amendment No. 2: S.R. 1985/118

“(2) The fee for a certificate of registration as a podiatrist shall be \$22.

“(3) The fee for an annual licence issued to a registered podiatrist shall be \$88.

“(4) The fee for an alteration in or addition to an entry in the register, other than a change of address or correction of an error for which the person registered is not responsible, shall be \$11.

“(5) The fee for restoration of a name to the register under section 21 of the Act shall be \$38.50.

“(6) The fee for inspection of the register shall be \$22.

“(7) The fee for examination under regulation 4 (1) (b) of these regulations shall be \$55.”

3. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The fees fixed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and service tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

4. Revocation—The Podiatrists Regulations 1982, Amendment No. 2 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1989, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Podiatrists Regulations 1982.
