



THE PESTICIDES REGULATIONS 1983, AMENDMENT NO. 4

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 76 of the Pesticides Act 1979, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Agriculture tendered on the recommendation of the Pesticides Board and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Pesticides Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Pesticides Regulations 1983* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1988.

2. Application fee for registration—(1) Regulation 3 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Pesticides Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 1) is hereby amended by omitting the expression “\$250”, and substituting the expression “\$350”.

(2) The Pesticides Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 1 are hereby consequentially revoked.

3. Annual registration fee—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 3A (as inserted by regulation 2 of the Pesticides Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 3), and substituting the following regulation:

“3A. (1) In this regulation, the term “registration year” means a period of 12 consecutive months commencing with the 1st day of April in any year.

“(2) Subject to the succeeding provisions of this regulation, where a pesticide registered under the Act is still registered at the commencement of a registration year, there shall be payable, on or before the 30th day of April in that registration year, a fee of \$350 in respect of that pesticide for that registration year.

“(3) Where any pesticide is registered under the Act for the first time during any registration year, no fee shall be payable under this regulation in respect of that pesticide for the remainder of that registration year.

“(4) No fee shall be payable under this regulation for any registration year where, before the 30th day of April in that registration year, the proprietor applies to the Board for cancellation of the registration of the pesticide.”

4. Amount of goods and services tax excluded—The fees fixed by these regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1988, relate to the fees payable for registration of a pesticide under the Pesticides Act 1979.

Regulation 2 increases from \$250 to \$350 the fee payable on application for registration.

Regulation 3 increases from \$270 to \$350 the annual fee for continued registration. It also makes all annual fees payable as at 1 April in each year, rather than within 1 month of demand by the Pesticides Board.

The fees are exclusive of goods and services tax.
