

THE PASSPORT (FEES) REGULATIONS 1998

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 17th day of May 1993

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 40 of the Passports Act 1992, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Passport (Fees) Regulations 1993.
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 29th day of May 1993.

- **2. Interpretation**—In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "The Act" means the Passports Act 1992:
 - "Passport" means a New Zealand passport: "Secretary" means the Secretary for Internal Affairs.
- **3. Fees**—(1) Fees in accordance with the Schedule to these regulations shall be payable in respect of the several matters specified in the Schedule.
- (2) Where an application, in respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, is lodged—
 - (a) In New Zealand; or
 - (b) In Rarotonga by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in the Cook Islands; or
 - (c) In Niue by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Niue; or
 - (d) In Apia by a New Zealand citizen who is ordinarily resident in Tokelau,—
- a fee shall be payable in accordance with column A in that Schedule.
- (3) Where subclause (2) of this regulation does not apply to an application made in respect of any matter specified in the Schedule to these regulations, a fee shall be payable in accordance with column B in that Schedule.
- 4. Priority service fee—(1) Subject to regulation 7 of these regulations, the priority service fee specified in paragraph 10 of the Schedule to these regulations shall be payable in respect of any application for the urgent issue, renewal, or endorsement of any passport or the urgent issue of a certificate of identity, being an application that is required to be processed within a timeframe that requires that application to be given priority over other applications of the same type.
- (2) The priority service fee may be payable either at the time at which the application is made or subsequently.
- **5. Callout fee**—Subject to regulation 7 of these regulations, the callout fee specified in paragraph 11 of the Schedule to these regulations shall be payable in respect of any application for the urgent issue, renewal, or endorsement of any passport or the urgent issue of a certificate of identity, being an application that is required to be processed within a timeframe that requires the attendance of officers outside of ordinary working hours.
- **6. Callout and priority service fees to be additional fees**—(1) Where a priority service fee is payable under regulation 4 of these regulations or a callout fee is payable under regulation 5 of these regulations in respect of an application, that fee shall be payable in addition to whatever other fee is payable in respect of that application.
- (2) Both a priority service fee and a callout fee shall not be payable in respect of the same application.
- 7. Priority service fees and callout fees not payable in respect of certain applications—Notwithstanding regulations 4 and 5 of these regulations, neither a priority service fee nor a callout fee shall be payable in respect of an application if the Secretary is satisfied that the time at which the application is made is dictated by the applicant's urgent need to travel and that that urgent need to travel arises because of a situation involving—

- (a) The death or serious illness of-
 - (i) A member of the applicant's family; or
 - (ii) A friend or business associate of the applicant; or
- (b) The serious illness of the applicant.
- **8. Payment of fees**—Except as provided in regulation 4 (2) of these regulations, all fees prescribed by these regulations shall be payable on the making of the relevant application and shall not be refundable if the application is declined.
- **9. Goods and services tax included**—The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.
- **10. Revocations**—The following regulations are hereby consequentially revoked:
 - (a) The Passport Regulations 1981*:

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 29 May 1993, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Passports Act 1992.
