**THE PUBLIC SERVICE AMENDING REGULATIONS 1939 (NO. 2).**

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912, the Public Service Commissioner doth, subject to the approval of the Governor-General in Council, hereby make the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Service Amending Regulations 1939 (No. 2).

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Public Service Act, 1912, on the 31st day of March, 1913\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making and approval hereof.

4. Regulation 178 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the number "200" representing the maximum marks for Subject No. (16), Applied Mechanics, and substituting the number "400."

5. Regulation 178A of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—

"178A. For candidates for appointment as junior draughtsmen the following subjects are compulsory:—

	Maximum Marks.
" (1) English .. .. .	400.
" (1A) Handwriting or lettering ..	100.
" (2) Arithmetic and (15) Mathematics ..	300 and 400 respectively.
or " (2) Practical mathematics and (16) Applied mechanics ..	300 and 400 respectively.
" (27) Trade drawing .. .. .	200.
" (28) Drawing (freehand and instru- mental) .. .. .	200.

"Such candidates shall select in addition any one other subject with a maximum of 200 marks. Maximum obtainable, 1,800."

6. Regulation 181A of the principal regulations is amended by adding to subparagraph (b), (Practical Mathematics) of paragraph (2), of the prescription therein contained the following additional words :—

“ Angular measurement in degrees and radians. The circular functions of angles from 0 to  $\pi$  radians, including graphic representations. Trigonometrical ratios from tables, and by graphical method ; also by calculation from the angles 30°, 45°, 60°. Application of simple formulæ, without proof, to the solution of triangles. Elementary problems involving the application of trigonometrical ratios to the solution of right-angled triangles.”
