**THE PUBLIC SERVICE (PRINTING AND STATIONERY)
REGULATIONS, 1930, AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

Enacting authority: The Public Service Commissioners with the approval of the Governor-General in Council.

Acts pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Public Service Act, 1912, and section 41 of the Finance Act, 1936.

Date on which the regulations were made: 9th day of March, 1937.

Date of approval by the Governor-General in Council: 18th day of March, 1937.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 1st day of April, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Service (Printing and Stationery) Regulations, 1930, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations affecting employees in the Printing and Stationery Department made under the Public Service Act, 1912, on the 14th day of April, 1930* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

4. Regulation 54 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the word "six", and substituting therefor the word "five".

5. Regulation 55 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—

CONDITIONS GOVERNING GRANTING OF ANNUAL LEAVE.

55. The granting of any such leave of absence shall be subject to the express conditions—

(a) That the behaviour of the employee has been in every way satisfactory:

(b) That his duties have been satisfactorily performed.

Where an officer has been absent on sick or special leave, whether with or without pay, exceeding thirty days in one or more periods in any leave year, the period of annual leave shall be reduced by one day for every thirty days (including Saturdays and Sundays) of such absence.
