



**THE PARLIAMENTARY SUPERANNUATION DETERMINATION
1984**

PURSUANT to sections 12 (1)(b) and 17 of the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977, the Higher Salaries Commission, acting after consultation with the Government Actuary and the Superintendent of the Government Superannuation Fund, hereby makes the following determination.

DETERMINATION

1. Title and commencement—(1) This determination may be cited as the Parliamentary Superannuation Determination 1984.

(2) This determination shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1984.

2. Government Superannuation Fund Act 1956 to apply as if allowance were salary—It is hereby determined that the Government Superannuation Fund Act 1956 shall apply in respect of the allowance payable to members of the House of Representatives under the Economic Stabilisation (Cost-of-Living Allowance) Regulations 1984* as if that allowance were salary.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the determination, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This determination, which comes into force on 1 April 1984, has the effect of making the allowance payable to Members of Parliament under the Economic Stabilisation (Cost-of-Living Allowance) Regulations 1984 salary for superannuation purposes.

This means that Members of Parliament will be liable to pay contributions on the allowance as if it were salary, and the allowance will be treated as salary for the calculation of superannuation entitlements and benefits.
