## THE PARLIAMENTARY SALARIES DETERMINATION 1985

PURSUANT to section 16 of the Civil List Act 1979 and to the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977, the Higher Salaries Commission hereby makes the following determination.

### DETERMINATION

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) This determination may be cited as the Parliamentary Salaries Determination 1985.

(2) This determination shall be deemed to have come into force on the 10th day of January 1985.

**2. Salaries**—The salaries payable pursuant to section 16 of the Civil List Act 1979 shall be those set out in the Schedule to this determination.

**3. Revocation**—The Parliamentary Salaries Determination 1982\* is hereby revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the determination, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This determination, which is deemed to have come into force on 10 January 1985, increases Parliamentary salaries.

It makes two separate adjustments, which match general adjustments being granted to State servants. The first adjustment incorporates the cost-of-living allowance of \$8 a week which was payable from 1 April 1984 under the Economic Stabilisation (Cost-of-Living Allowance) Regulations 1984. The second adjustment, being 7 percent of the resultant amount, is made under section 20 (2) of the Higher Salaries Commission Act 1977.

The effective date of the new rates prescribed by this determination is 10 January 1985, which is the same as the effective date of the general adjustment to salaries of State servants.

This determination does not effect any change in Parliamentary allowances, and is separate and distinct from the General Review, as at 1 April 1985, of all salaries and allowances within the jurisdiction of the Higher Salaries Commission.
