**THE PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940,
AMENDMENT NO. 3.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 5th day of
November, 1940.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding to Regulation 2 the following clause :—

“(4) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in clause (3) of this regulation, any person who is found committing an offence against this regulation by distributing or facilitating the distribution of any document containing any subversive statement or by having in his possession any such document with a view to distributing it or to facilitating its distribution, or who is reasonably suspected of having committed or of being about to commit any such offence, may be arrested without warrant and may be remanded in custody or on bail, and the consent of the Attorney-General shall not be required to the commencement of a prosecution for any such offence, but no further or other proceedings shall be taken until that consent has been obtained.”
