### THE PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 5

## C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 4th day of March, 1942.

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Public Safety Emergency Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in the definition of the term "subversive statement" in clause (3), after paragraph (e), the following paragraph:—
  - "(ee) A statement intended or likely to prejudice the relations between His Majesty's subjects and any friendly foreign State or the subjects of any such State:".
