**THE POST-PRIMARY SCHOOL GRANTS REGULATIONS 1949,
AMENDMENT NO. 2**

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraphs (k) and (l) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraph :—

“(k) Expenses of breaking-up ceremonies and school prizes up to a maximum of £35 for a school with a roll not exceeding 500 pupils on the 1st day of March in the year of the grant, and up to a maximum of £50 for a school with a roll exceeding 500 pupils on that date :”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]
