



THE POST-PRIMARY SCHOOL GRANTS REGULATIONS 1949, AMENDMENT NO. 3

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended, as from the 31st day of March 1952, by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the following paragraph:—

“(a) A grant applicable in accordance with regulation 5 hereof for the general purposes of the school, which grant shall be at a rate ascertained in accordance with the following scale, and shall be increased in the case of any governing body which controls more than one school at the rate of £150 a year for each school in excess of one:—

| Number of Weekly Teaching Half-days for All Schools Under the Governing Body. | Yearly Rate of Payment for Each Weekly Teaching Half-day. |

| For all in normal day classes in excess of 200 | 10 |
| For the first 300 weekly teaching half-days in technical or continuation day or evening classes | 18 |
| For all in technical or continuation day or evening classes in excess of 300 | 15 |

3. Nothing in regulation 3 of the principal regulations or regulation 16 of the Education Amending Regulations 1950 or regulation 2 of these regulations shall increase the rate of the grant payable under paragraph (a) of regulation 3 of the principal regulations before the 1st day of April 1952.

4. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended, as from the 31st day of January 1953, by omitting from paragraph (b) the words "rate of £1", and substituting the words "rate of 15s."

5. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in paragraph (b) of regulation 3 of the principal regulations, the grant payable under that paragraph for the period commencing on the passing of these regulations and ending with the 31st day of January 1953 shall be at the rate necessary to reduce the average rate of the grant payable under that paragraph for the period commencing on the 1st day of April 1952 and ending with the 31st day of January 1953 to 15s. a year for each pupil to whom the paragraph applies.

6. Subclause (1) of regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended—

(a) By inserting, after the words "by the governing body", the words "on receipt of the grant or as soon as practicable thereafter":

(b) By omitting the words "cost of plant and", and substituting the words "replacement cost of plant and permanent":

(c) By adding the following proviso:—

"Provided that the governing body may in its discretion credit to the Renewals Reserve Account larger percentages of the aforesaid grants than the percentages specified in this subclause."

7. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (h) of subclause (2) the words "for which the prior approval of the Director has been obtained".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*]

These regulations vary the rates of certain of the grants payable to the governing bodies of Post-primary schools and make minor amendments of the provisions governing the expenditure of those grants.
