**THE POST-PRIMARY SCHOOL GRANTS REGULATIONS 1960,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

THE HON. J. R. HANAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1960, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post-primary School Grants Regulations 1960* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) A grant applicable in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations for the general purposes of the school, which grant shall be ascertained in accordance with the following scale:

Provided that, where the Minister of Education considers that a technical school is providing technical classes or courses of a special or advanced character, he may require that the grant provided for under this paragraph shall not apply to that school; and in that case the governing body of the school shall be paid instead thereof a special grant for the general purposes of the school of an amount to be determined by the Minister of Education with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, which grant shall be applicable in accordance with regulation 6 of these regulations, except that the amount of the grant applicable in accordance with subclause (1) of that regulation shall be determined by the Minister of Education with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance:

Provided also that where the Minister of Education so approves a further grant may be paid to the governing body of a school during any of the first four years after the establishment of the school, but any such further grant shall not, in the first year, exceed twenty per cent of the grant otherwise payable under this paragraph for the year, or in any subsequent year exceed ten per cent of the grant otherwise payable under this paragraph for the year:"

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 4, and substituting the following regulation:

"4. The Minister of Education may, in each year ending with the 31st day of January, authorise payment to the governing body of any school of further grants in respect of the cost of heating, lighting, water supply, and swimming-bath filtration. All grants authorised under this regulation shall be computed on a basis approved by the Minister of Finance."

4. Regulation 6 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (1) of subclause (2) the words "under circumstances approved by the Director".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations alter the amount of the grants that may be made to the governing bodies of post-primary schools for general purposes, heating, lighting, water supply, and swimming-bath filtration. They also vary the regulation governing the payment of a grant for reasonable expenses incurred in the hire of a hall for a school break-up ceremony.
