ORDER IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 7 (1) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Private Schools Integration Programme Order 1976, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Private Schools Integration Programme Order 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).
- (2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- **2. Extension of phased programme approved**—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 2, the following regulation:

"2A. The Minister shall approve the establishment of private schools as integrated schools so that the total amount expended on and in the establishment of private schools as integrated schools in the year ending with the 31st day of March 1983 does not exceed \$27,000,000."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order amends the Private Schools Integration Programme Order 1976 so as to continue the approved phased programme for the integration of private schools into the State system (which programme began on 1 April 1976 and extended to 31 March 1982) until 31 March 1983. It provides that the integration of schools during the 1982–83 financial year should be such that its cost does not exceed \$27,000,000. The limit already fixed for 1981–82 is \$52,700,000, but included payments to schools already integrated and schools whose proprietors had indicated their intention to integrate.
