ORDER

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Public Service Salary Order 1947.
- 2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October, 1947.
- 3. The Public Service Salary Order 1946* and the scale set out in the Schedule thereto of salaries payable to officers of the Professional Division and the Clerical Division of the Public Service administered under the Public Service Act, 1912, are hereby revoked.
- 4. The scale set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby substituted for the scale hereby revoked.
- 5. The increments of the respective subdivisions of each of the classes shown in the said scale shall be annual increments.
