THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 19 of the Appropriation Act, 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Service Salary Order 1950.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1950.

3. The Public Service Salary Order 1947* and the scale set out in the Schedule thereto of salaries payable to officers of the Professional Division and the Clerical Division of the Public Service administered under the Public Service Act, 1912, are hereby revoked.

4. The scale set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby substituted for the scale hereby revoked.

5. The increments of the respective subdivisions of each of the classes shown in the said scale shall be annual increments.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

The regulations amend the scale of salaries payable to officers of the Professional and Clerical Division of the Public Service to conform with Principal Order No. 27 of the Government Service Tribunal and enable the Public Service Commission to grade positions up to £1,200 per annum without obtaining individual appropriations.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act, 1936.

Date of notification in *Gazette* : 14th day of December, 1950.

These regulations are administered by the Public Service Commission.
