ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of December 1961

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 19 of the Appropriation Act 1920, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Public Service Salary Order 1961.

(2) This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October 1961.

2. The scale set out in the Schedule hereto of salaries payable to officers of the Professional Division and the Clerical Division of the Public Service is hereby substituted for the scale prescribed by the Public Service Salary Order 1960* (as amended by the Public Service Salary Order 1960, Amendment No. 1†).

3. The increments of the respective subdivisions of each of the classes shown in the scales shall be annual increments:

Provided that the maximum salary payable to any officer may be fixed at the salary for any subdivision of a class.

4. The Public Service Salary Order 1960* and the Public Service Salary Order 1960, Amendment No. 1†, are hereby revoked.
