# THE PASSENGER SERVICE VEHICLE CONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS 1954, AMENDMENT NO. 10

PURSUANT to the Transport Act 1962, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. School bus signs—Regulation 89 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3) (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following subclause:

"(3) School bus signs shall be fitted and displayed on the outside of every school bus in accordance with regulation 33A of the Traffic Regulations 1956<sup>†</sup>."

#### 1974/21 Passenger Service Vehicle Construction Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 10
