THE POST-PRIMARY TEACHERS' BURSARIES REGULATIONS 1948, AMENDMENT NO. 1

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post-primary Teachers' Bursaries Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post-primary Teachers' Bursaries Regulations 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended, as from the 1st day of January 1952, by omitting from subclause (2) the word "October", and substituting the word "September".

3. (1) Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (1) the following proviso :—

"Provided that, if in the opinion of the Director the circumstances of the holder of a bursary are such that, though he is not obliged to live away from home, he will be unable to pursue his studies without additional financial assistance, the maximum annual value of the bursary may be increased by such an amount not exceeding £40 as the Director may approve."

(2) Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause :—

"(2) The normal term of any Post-primary Teachers' Bursary shall be three years :

"Provided that a bursary may, at the discretion of the Director,-

"(a) Be awarded for a shorter period; or

"(b) Be extended to a fourth or fifth year."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations change the closing date for applications for Post-primary Teachers' Bursaries; provide that where bursars live at home but are unable to pursue their studies without additional financial assistance the maximum annual value of the bursary may be increased by an amount not exceeding $\pounds 40$; and authorize the Director of Education to extend bursaries to a fifth year.
