**THE POST-PRIMARY TEACHERS' BURSARIES REGULATIONS  
1948, AMENDMENT No. 2**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Post-primary Teachers' Bursaries Regulations 1948, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post-primary Teachers' Bursaries Regulations 1948\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (c) of subclause (1) the words "age of seventeen years", and substituting the words "age of sixteen years".

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]*

These regulations provide that a candidate for a Post-primary Teachers' Bursary must have reached the age of sixteen years on 31 December in the year in which the application for the bursary is submitted. The age now prescribed is seventeen years on the corresponding date.
