



**THE PASSENGER-SERVICE TIME-TABLES EMERGENCY  
REGULATIONS 1943**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Passenger-service Time-tables Emergency Regulations 1943.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, expressions defined in the Transport Licensing Act, 1931,\* have the meanings so defined.

3. In the exercise of its powers and functions in relation to the prescribing, review, or alteration of the time-tables or frequency of service for any passenger-service, the Transport Appeal Authority and every District Licensing Authority (including a Metropolitan Authority) shall act in accordance with all directions, general or special, given in that behalf by the Minister of Transport.

4. Where a Licensing Authority intends of its own motion or on any application to make any decision pursuant to any such direction and without exercising its own discretion, the provisions of subsection (2) of section 34 of the Transport Licensing Act, 1931, or of section 6 of the Transport Licensing Amendment Act, 1936, as the case may be, shall not apply.

5. There shall be no right of appeal under section 12 of the Transport Licensing Amendment Act, 1936, from any decision given by a Licensing Authority pursuant to any direction under these regulations and without exercising its own discretion.
