**THE PRIMARY TEACHERS GRADING REGULATIONS 1926,
AMENDMENT NO. 2.**

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of
January, 1938.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Primary Teachers Grading Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made by Order in Council dated the 30th day of March, 1926* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

4. Subclause (2) of clause 9 of the Order in Council made on the 11th day of February, 1935,† is revoked.

5. Clause 16 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted :—

“ 16. A teacher graded in any group according to clauses 4 and 5 of these regulations and eligible for a maximum of at least 25 marks for organization and management may be graded in the next higher group if in the opinion of the grading officers he could discharge efficiently the duties normally associated with teachers in such higher group, and if the grading officers consider that he could not otherwise be placed in his correct relative position.”
