**THE PUBLIC TRUST OFFICE REGULATIONS 1958,
AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of July 1965

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Trust Office Act 1957, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Public Trust Office Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Public Trust Office Regulations 1958* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1965.

2. (1) Regulation 9 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Public Trust Office Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 3, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "4 $\frac{5}{8}$ per cent", and substituting the words "4 $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent".

(2) This regulation shall not apply to any interest payable in respect of the period that ended with the 31st day of July 1965, and the increase in the rate of interest hereby made shall operate as from that date.

3. The Public Trust Office Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 3, are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase from $4\frac{5}{8}$ per cent to $4\frac{3}{4}$ per cent the rate of interest payable on and after 1 August 1965 on trust money in the Common Fund of the Public Trust Office which is not at call.
