**THE QUARRIES AMENDING REGULATIONS 1947**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of  
March, 1947

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Quarries Act, 1944, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Quarries Amending Regulations 1947.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Stone-quarries Act, 1910 (and enuring under the Quarries Act, 1944), on the 30th day of January, 1922, and published in the *Gazette* on the 2nd day of the following month at page 237 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. Regulation 55 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

“ 55. Each workman working on the face of the quarry above the level of the quarry floor shall be at all times attached to a properly secured safety-rope by means of a safety-belt or other appliance approved by the Inspector, and every workman shall, before commencing work on the face of the quarry as aforesaid, satisfy himself as to the safety of the rope and safety-belt or other appliance and shall not use anything that he finds unsafe.”
