PURSUANT to section 62 of the Law Practitioners Act 1982, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Queen's Counsel Regulations 1987, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Queen's Counsel Regulations 1987* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 13th day of March 1989.

2. Fee increased—Regulation 4 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$100", and substituting the expression "\$150".

3. Fee inclusive of goods and services tax—The fee fixed by these regulations is inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 13 March 1989, increase from \$100 to \$150 the fee payable on appointment as a Queen's Counsel.
