ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 21st day
of June, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Quarantine Emergency Regulations, 1944, and shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1944.

2. While these regulations are in force, section 107 of the Health Act, 1920, and the Quarantine Regulations 1921* shall be read subject to the following provisions of these regulations.

3. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section 107 of the Health Act, 1920, or in Regulation 8 of the Quarantine Regulations 1921,* it shall not be competent for any Port Health Officer, in the course of his duties, to make inquiries of the master of any ship to which that section applies or of any other person as to the port of departure from which the ship has come to New Zealand or the places at which she has touched in the course of her voyage, or the port of embarkation of any passenger, and it shall not be the duty of the master of any such ship or of any other person to make any report or to give to the Port Health Officer any information that would disclose any such particulars.

(2) In lieu of the particulars referred to in the last preceding subclause, the Port Health Officer may require the master to furnish particulars as to the zone or zones (as hereinafter defined) from which the ship has come or through which she has passed in the course of her voyage, or within which any passenger or passengers embarked.

(3) While these regulations are in force, every report made by the master of a ship, in the form numbered (1) in the First Schedule to the Quarantine Regulations 1921,* shall be marked "Secret"; the references in the said form to the port and date of departure, to the ports of call, to the ports at which water was taken on board, and to the port of embarkation of any passenger who may have died during the voyage, shall be deleted from the form; and the attention of the master shall be drawn by the Port Health Officer to the fact that such particulars are not to be disclosed in his report but that in lieu thereof he shall indicate in the report the zone or zones through which the ship has passed in the course of her voyage.

(4) For the purposes of this regulation the term "zone" shall be deemed to be an area defined by the Director-General of Health with the concurrence of the Naval Secretary.
