**THE QUARANTINE (AIR) REGULATIONS 1952,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 11th day of July 1962

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Quarantine (Air) Regulations 1952, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Quarantine (Air) Regulations 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:

- (a) By omitting the definition of the term "foyer":
- (b) By omitting from the definition of the term "infected aircraft", the words "typhus fever, relapsing fever":
- (c) By omitting from paragraph (i) of the definition of the term "infected local area" the word "foyer", and substituting the words "non-imported case":
- (d) By revoking paragraph (iv) of the definition of the term "infected local area", and substituting the following paragraph:
 "(iv) A local area where activity of yellow fever virus is found in vertebrates other than man."

3. Paragraph (b) of regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "or destruction".

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 23, the following regulation:

“23A. (1) The Director-General of Health may from time to time, in his discretion, exempt any aircraft, or aircraft of any specified class, from all or any of the provisions of subclause (1) of regulation 21 or regulation 23 hereof.

“(2) Any such exemption may be general or may apply only in specified circumstances or classes of circumstances.

“(3) The Director-General may at any time revoke or vary any exemption granted under this regulation.”

5. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the words “Wellington Airport”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations—

- (a) Amend existing definitions in accordance with requirements of the International Sanitary Regulations;
- (b) Withdraw the authority of a medical officer to require the destruction of articles which may have been exposed to infection;
- (c) Authorise the Director-General to relax certain precautionary provisions;
- (d) Add Wellington Airport to the list of sanitary aerodromes.
