**THE QUARANTINE (SHIP) REGULATIONS 1957,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of March 1969

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Quarantine (Ship) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Quarantine (Ship) Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1969.

2. Quarantine signal—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 4 (as amended by regulation 2 of the Quarantine (Ship) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following regulation:

“4. The quarantine signal required by section 100 of the Act shall be in such one of the following forms as is appropriate:

Amendment No. 1: S.R. 1962/113

Amendment No. 2: S.R. 1963/185

<i>Signal to be Hoisted</i>	<i>Signifying</i>
“(a) In the daytime— Q flag over first substitute (QQ)	I require health clearance.
(b) By night— A red light over a white light (the lights to be not more than 6 feet apart).	I require health clearance.”

(2) Regulation 2 of the Quarantine (Ship) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, is hereby revoked.

3. Fees for deratting certificates increased—Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (6), and substituting the following subclause:

“(6) The fee for a deratting certificate or a deratting exemption certificate shall be \$6.80, with an additional \$3.40 for every hour or part of an hour during which the inspector is occupied in supervising the fumigation or inspecting the ship.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1969, amend the Quarantine (Ship) Regulations 1957.

Regulation 2 prescribes new forms of quarantine signals to be used by any ship which requires health clearance.

Regulation 3 increases from \$4 to \$6.80 the fee payable for a deratting certificate or a deratting exemption certificate. The additional fee payable for every hour or part of an hour during which the inspector is occupied in supervising the fumigation or inspecting the ship is increased from \$2 to \$3.40.
