



**THE REHABILITATION ACT EXTENSION ORDER 1945**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 6th day of  
June, 1945

Present :

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Rehabilitation Act, 1941, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

**ORDER**

1. This Order may be cited as the Rehabilitation Act Extension Order 1945.

2. The following persons are hereby declared to be servicemen for the purposes of Part I of the Rehabilitation Act, 1941, namely :—

Persons who, not being ordinarily resident in New Zealand at the time of serving as hereinafter mentioned, have previously been so resident for a period exceeding ten years, or for periods exceeding ten years in the aggregate, and who have at any time during the present war—

(a) Served outside New Zealand as members of any of His Majesty's naval, military, or air Forces, or as members of the Armed Forces of any of His Majesty's Allies in the present war ; or

(b) Served outside New Zealand with any of those Forces as war correspondents or as members of any voluntary aid or other voluntary organization ; or

(c) Served in any capacity in any British ship.
