### Order

#### 1 Title

This order is the Rakiura National Park Order 2002.

#### 2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

### 3 Land declared national park

- (1) The land described in the Schedule—
- (a) is available to be declared a national park; and
  - (b) is declared a national park subject to the National Parks Act 1980.
- (2) In this order, **land** includes the waters and beds of all internal rivers, lakes, and streams; but excludes all legal roads.

### 4 National park named

The national park declared in regulation 3 is named Rakiura National Park.

### Explanatory note

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order establishes the Rakiura National Park on Stewart Island/Rakiura. It includes the bulk of the land held for reserve or conservation purposes on the island. The establishment of the park follows the usual processes under the National Parks Act 1980, including public consultation and a recommendation from the New Zealand Conservation Authority.

Stewart Island/Rakiura is a largely unspoilt area of natural and scenic beauty that is increasingly valued as a refuge for threatened species and examples of unmodified ecosystems. Vegetation ranges from coastal forest to alpine grassland. The landscape is rugged and unique, creating a particular wilderness character that justifies national park status.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 31 January 2002.
