THE REHABILITATION (PLUMBERS) REGULATIONS 1945

C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 29th day of August, 1945

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Rehabilitation Act, 1941, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Rehabilitation (Plumbers) Regulations 1945.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Plumbers Registration Act, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), or in any regulations thereunder the Plumbers' Board of New Zealand may, in its discretion, permit any discharged serviceman to present himself for the examinations referred to in paragraph (a) of section 17 of the said Act, or any part thereof, if he has been engaged in the plumbing trade, either as an apprentice or under any scheme established by the Rehabilitation Board for the training of discharged servicemen for that trade,—
 - (a) For not less than six months since he lawfully ceased to serve as a serviceman; and
 - (b) For not less than three years in all.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in paragraph (b) of section 17 of the said Act, the said Plumbers' Board may grant to any discharged serviceman who has passed the examinations referred to in paragraph (a) of the said section 17 a certificate of his having passed the examinations if he produces evidence to the satisfaction of the said Plumbers' Board that he has been engaged in the plumbing trade, either as an apprentice or under any scheme established by the Rehabilitation Board for the training of discharged servicemen for that trade.—
 - (a) For not less than six months since he lawfully ceased to serve as a serviceman: and
 - (b) For not less than four years in all.

4. It is hereby declared that if any person is engaged in the plumbing trade during any period while he is on leave with pay immediately prior to becoming a discharged serviceman, he shall be deemed for the purposes of these regulations to have already lawfully ceased to serve as a serviceman while he is so engaged.
