## THE SELWYN PLANTATION BOARD REGULATIONS 1964

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 1st day of July 1964

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Selwyn Plantation Board Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Selwyn Plantation Board Regulations 1964.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) Every person commits an offence against these regulations who, without the permission of the Board or an officer of the Board authorised by the Board in that behalf,—

- (a) Enters upon any plantation reserve otherwise than on the business of the Board:
- (b) Shoots, snares, or destroys any bird, or takes or destroys the nest of any bird, in any plantation reserve:
- (c) Takes, carries, or uses any firearm, fireworks, explosives, dangerous weapon, bow and arrow, catapult, or other instrument likely to be used for the destruction of animals or birds, in any plantation reserve:
- (d) Allows any horse, sheep, cattle, goat, or pig to be in any plantation reserve:
- (e) Lights any fire, removes any timber, deposits or removes any soil or gravel, or cuts, breaks, or disturbs the surface of the ground, in any plantation reserve:
- (f) Posts, sticks, stencils, paints, or otherwise affixes or causes to be affixed any notice, placard, advertisement, or other writing in any plantation reserve:
- (g) Erects any fence or other obstruction in any plantation reserve.

(2) Every person commits an offence against these regulations who, in any plantation reserve,—

- (a) Leaves bottles, glass, crockery, paper, confectionery, food, or other rubbish or litter:
- (b) Removes, breaks, destroys, defaces, or otherwise interferes with any notice, sign, seat, gate, fence, bridge, building, or other property belonging to the Board:
- (c) Uses any obscene, profane, or insulting language, performs any indecent or improper act, commits any breach of the peace, or behaves riotously or in an objectionable manner.

3. Any person who commits an offence against these regulations shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £5.

4. The Selwyn Plantation Regulations 1931,\* the Selwyn Plantation Regulations 1937†, and the Selwyn Plantation Amending Regulations 1949‡, are hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations repeat in substance the regulations previously in force in respect of the Selwyn Plantation Reserves which have not been superseded. Previous regulations are revoked and out of date provisions are not repeated.
