THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Summary Proceedings Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summary Proceedings Regulations 1958\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the fourteenth day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule, and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

NOTE—1. Where pursuant to any enactment several offences are charged in the one information (not being offences charged in the alternative), the fees to be taken shall be assessed as if separate informations had been laid in respect of the several offences charged.

2. The foregoing fees are not to be taken in proceedings under the Destitute Persons Act 1910, or in proceedings by way of complaint, or in proceedings under Part V of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957.”

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations prescribe a new scale of Court fees in proceedings under the Summary Proceedings Act 1957, the only changes being that, where several offences are charged in one information (not being offences charged in the alternative), the fees are to be assessed as if a separate information had been laid in respect of the several offences charged.
