PURSUANT to the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Dental Benefits) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Social Security (Dental Benefits) Regulations 1983\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1991.

**2. Application of regulations**—Regulation 4 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (c), and substituting the following paragraphs:

“(c) Aged 16 or 17 years and in respect of whom any one of the following benefits is payable under the Act:

- “(i) An orphan’s benefit:
- “(ii) An unsupported child’s benefit:
- “(iii) A family benefit:
- “(iv) An invalid’s benefit:
- “(v) An unemployment benefit:
- “(vi) A training benefit:
- “(vii) A job search allowance:
- “(viii) An independent youth benefit:
- “(ix) An emergency benefit; or

“(d) Aged 16 or 17 years and who is entitled to receive a basic grant or an independent circumstances grant under the Student Allowances Regulations 1988 (S.R. 1988/308).”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1991, extend entitlement to dental benefits to persons aged 16 or 17 years in respect of whom there is payable, under the Social Security Act 1964, an unsupported child’s benefit, an unemployment benefit, a training benefit, a job search allowance, or an independent youth benefit.
