**THE TRADE ARRANGEMENT (NETHERLANDS) ORDER 1945**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 17th day of  
October, 1945

Present :

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to section 3 of the Trade Arrangement (New Zealand and Belgium) Ratification Act, 1933, and to all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade Arrangement (Netherlands) Order 1945.

2. The Trade Arrangement (New Zealand and Netherlands) Order 1938\* is hereby revoked.

3. The duties provided for by the Trade Arrangement (New Zealand and Belgium) Ratification Act, 1933 (as modified by an Order in Council made on the 28th day of August, 1936†), in respect of goods being the produce or manufacture of the Economic Union of Belgium and Luxemburg are hereby applied to similar goods, of the classes included in the items of the Customs Tariff of New Zealand mentioned in the Schedule hereto, being the produce or manufacture of the Netherlands in Europe.

## SCHEDULE

76	Cigars, including the weight of every brand, wrapper, or attachment, to any cigar.
Ex 338	<p><i>Machinery or appliances</i>, electrical, viz. :—</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) (a) Machinery or appliances n.e.i. peculiar to the generation of electricity, to the transformation of pressures of electric currents, or to the conversion of one type of electric current to another; electric motors; slide rails for electric generators or electric motors</li> <li>(b) Batteries or cells not including storage batteries</li> <li>(2) Switchboards, fuse boards, and distribution boards or boxes for electric circuits; shunt or voltage regulators; starters or controllers for electric motors; rheostats, and resistances n.e.i. including reactance or choking coils, for the reduction or control of electric currents, condensers, relays, electro-magnets, switches, wall-plugs and shoes or sockets therefor, circuit breakers, circuit makers, cut-outs, fuses, wire or cable connectors and similar articles, and terminals; lightning arresters for the protection of electrical apparatus</li> <li>(3) Carbons for electrodes for arc lamps, for electric furnaces, or for electric welding</li> <li>(4) Electric appliances n.e.i. peculiar to electro-plating, electro-chemistry, electro-metallurgy, surgery, telegraphy, telephony (not including cabinets or parts of cabinets for wireless broadcast receiving sets); X-ray tubes and electrical vacuum tubes not suitable for purposes of illumination</li> <li>(5) Electric locomotives; trolley-poles or collectors for electric trams-cars or electric locomotives; frogs, crossings, and line-ears for overhead conductors for electric railways or tramways; rail bonds with terminals attached</li> <li>(6) Metal poles or towers, specially suited for use in electrical transmission-lines</li> <li>(7) Insulated cable and wire; carbon in block, sheet, or rod; mica, vulcanite, insulating-tape, and other insulating materials n.e.i., not including insulating piping or tubing, or insulating fittings for pipes</li> <li>(8) Sparking-plugs for oil engines</li> <li>(10) N.e.i.</li> </ol>
352	Machinery, machines, machine tools, engines, and appliances, as may be approved by the Minister, peculiar to use in manufacturing, industrial and similar processes.
