REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Tokelau Coinage (Commemorative Coins) Regulations 1993.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

World War Two Series Coins

2. Tokelau 1993 Battle of the Bulge Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Battle of the Bulge Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
 - (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Battle of the Bulge Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:
 - (b) For the reverse impression, a representation of a United States Army tank, with a forest in the background and the impression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the representation. The expressions “• “BATTLE OF THE BULGE” •” and “DECEMBER 1944” shall appear around the periphery of the coins, with the expression “• “BATTLE OF THE BULGE” •” being above the representation, and the expression “DECEMBER 1944” being below the representation.

3. Tokelau 1993 Admirals Nimitz and Halsey Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Admirals Nimitz and Halsey Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Admirals Nimitz and Halsey Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of Admiral Chester William Nimitz in the foreground and the effigy of Admiral William Halsey slightly behind and to the right of the first effigy, with the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the effigies. The expression "• ADMIRALS NIMITZ & HALSEY •" shall appear around the periphery of the top of the coins.

4. Tokelau 1993 General MacArthur Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 General MacArthur Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 General MacArthur Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of General Douglas MacArthur, with the expression "I SHALL RETURN" to the left of the effigy, and the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the effigy. The expression "• GENERAL MACARTHUR •" shall appear around the periphery of the top of the coins.

5. Tokelau 1993 M.I.A.s and P.O.W.s Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 M.I.A.s and P.O.W.s Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 M.I.A.s and P.O.W.s Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern

and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":

- (b) For the reverse impression, a representation of a watchtower at a detention camp, with a barbed wire fence in the foreground and individuals visible through the barbed wire, with huts in the background, and with the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the watchtower. The expressions "• M.I.A.s + P.O.W.s •" and "WE REMEMBER" shall appear around the periphery of the coins, with the expression "• M.I.A.s + P.O.W.s •" being above the representation, and the expression "WE REMEMBER" being below the representation.

6. Tokelau 1993 Generals Patton and Bradley Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Generals Patton and Bradley Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
 - (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Generals Patton and Bradley Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of General Omar Nelson Bradley in the foreground and the effigy of General George Smith Patton slightly behind and to the left of the first effigy, with the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the effigies. The expression "• GEN. PATTON • GEN. BRADLEY" shall appear around the periphery of the coins above the effigies.

7. Tokelau 1993 Anne Frank Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Anne Frank Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
 - (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Anne Frank Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of Anne Frank, with an open book in the foreground, in the background an arched wall through which is an open gateway, and with the expression

“\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, superimposed on the book. The expressions “• ANNE FRANK •” and “LEST WE FORGET” shall appear around the periphery of the coins, with the expression “• ANNE FRANK •” being above the effigy, and the expression “LEST WE FORGET” being below the effigy.

8. Tokelau 1993 Chennault-Doolittle-Boyington Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Chennault-Doolittle-Boyington Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
 - (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Chennault-Doolittle-Boyington Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:
 - (b) For the reverse impression, representations of 3 United States aircraft (a B-25 bomber, a Curtis P-40 Warhawk, and a Vought F4U Corsair), flying in formation, with the expression “HEROES OF THE AIR” above the representations, and the expression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the representations. The expression “• DOOLITTLE • CHENNAULT • BOYINGTON” shall appear around the periphery of the coins.

9. Tokelau 1993 Tuskegee Airmen Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Tuskegee Airmen Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
 - (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Tuskegee Airmen Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a United States fighter pilot, with representations of 3 United States fighter aircraft to the right of the effigy, and the expression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the effigy. The expression “• TUSKEGEE AIRMEN •” shall appear around the periphery of the top of the coins.

10. Tokelau 1993 Normandy D-Day Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be

made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Normandy D-Day Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Normandy D-Day Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, a representation of United States Marines in an amphibious boat waiting to land on the shores of Normandy beach, with a representation of Normandy beach in the background, and the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the representation of the Marines. The expressions "• NORMANDY-D-DAY •" and "JUNE 6th 1944" shall appear around the periphery of the coins, with the expression "• NORMANDY-D-DAY •" being above the representations, and the expression "JUNE 6th 1944" being below the representations.

11. Tokelau 1993 Native American Code Talkers Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Native American Code Talkers Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Native American Code Talkers Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a native American wearing a radio headset and speaking into a microphone, with a representation of a native American Indian head-dress to the left of the effigy, and the expression "\$50" or "\$20", as the case may require, below the effigy. The expression "• NATIVE AMERICAN CODE TALKERS" shall appear around the periphery of the coins.

12. Tokelau 1993 Carriers—The Strike Force Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Carriers—The Strike Force Commemorative Fifty Dollars:

- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Carriers—
The Strike Force Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:
 - (b) For the reverse impression, a representation of a United States aircraft carrier, with 3 fighter aircraft above the representation, and the expression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the representation. The expression “• CARRIERS • THE STRIKE FORCE •” shall appear around the periphery of the top of the coins.

13. Tokelau 1993 Women in the Armed Services Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Women in the Armed Services Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Women in the Armed Services Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:
 - (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a woman in military uniform in salute stance, with the expression “WAVES • WASPS • WACS • SPARS • ARMY & NAVY NURSING CORPS” around the effigy, and the expression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the effigy. The expression “• WOMEN IN THE ARMED SERVICES” shall appear around the periphery of the coins.

14. Tokelau 1993 Polish Freedom Fighters Commemorative Fifty Dollars and Twenty Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau may cause to be made and issued either or both of the following coins, which coins shall be legal tender only in Tokelau:

- (a) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Polish Freedom Fighters Commemorative Fifty Dollars:
- (b) A commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Polish Freedom Fighters Commemorative Twenty Dollars.
- (2) The design for the coins shall be as follows:
 - (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coins shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “TOKELAU • 1993”:

- (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a decorated Polish soldier, with a representation of soldiers in the streets of a Polish city in the background, the expressions “*WARSAW”, “*CZESTOCHOWA”, “*GDANSK”, and “*CRACOW” listed to the right of the effigy and below the representation, and the expression “\$50” or “\$20”, as the case may require, below the effigy. The expression “POLISH FREEDOM FIGHTERS” shall appear around the periphery of the top of the coins.

Other Coins

15. Tokelau 1993 First Orbit Commemorative Five Dollars—

(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 First Orbit Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

(a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “* TOKELAU • 1993”:

(b) For the reverse impression, a representation of the sun, with a spacecraft orbiting the sun, the earth in the background to the left of the representation, the expression “\$5” above the representation, and the expression “LIMA TALA” between that expression and the representation. The expression “1968 FIRST ORBIT” shall appear around the periphery of the left side of the coin.

16. Tokelau 1993 Endangered Wildlife Commemorative Five Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Endangered Wildlife Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

(a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression “* TOKELAU • 1993”:

(b) For the reverse impression, a representation of an iguana on the branch of a tree, with the expression “\$5” above the back of the representation. The expressions “ENDANGERED WILDLIFE” and “LIMA TALA” shall appear around the periphery of the coin, with the expression “ENDANGERED WILDLIFE” being in the top left quarter of the coin, and the expression “LIMA TALA” being in the bottom right quarter of the coin.

17. Tokelau 1993 HMS Pandora Commemorative Five Dollars—

(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 HMS Pandora Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
- (b) For the reverse impression, a representation of a sailing ship, with 3 sailors on deck, an islet to the right of the representation, and the expression "HMS PANDORA" between the representation and the islet. Below the representation shall appear a canoe being paddled by 2 Tokelauan men. The expression "\$5 • LIMA TALA" shall appear around the periphery of the bottom left quarter of the coin.

18. Tokelau 1993 World Cup 1994 Commemorative Five Dollars—

(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 World Cup 1994 Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
- (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a man in football uniform in a running position, with a football to the right of the effigy's feet, a representation of lines of longitude and latitude in the background, 3 islets to the left of the effigy, and a map of North America and Central America to the right of the effigy. A bald eagle with wings spread shall be superimposed on the map, within the boundaries of the United States of America. The expressions "WORLD CUP USA '94" and "\$5 • LIMA TALA" shall appear around the periphery of the coin, with the expression "WORLD CUP USA '94" being above the effigy, and the expression "\$5 • LIMA TALA" being below the effigy.

19. Tokelau 1993 Olympic Games 1992 Commemorative Five Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Olympic Games 1992 Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
- (b) For the reverse impression, the effigy of a man sailing a windsurfer, with an islet in the background. The expressions "OLYMPIC GAMES 1992" and "\$5 • LIMA TALA" shall appear around the

periphery of the coin, with the expression "OLYMPIC GAMES 1992" being above the effigy, and the expression "\$5 • LIMA TALA" being below the effigy.

20. Tokelau 1993 Olympic Games 1996 Commemorative Five Dollars—(1) The Administrator of Tokelau shall cause to be made and issued a commemorative coin to be known as the Tokelau 1993 Olympic Games 1996 Commemorative Five Dollars, which shall be legal tender only in Tokelau.

(2) The design for the coin shall be as follows:

- (a) For the obverse impression, the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen in profile wearing a diadem. A border pattern around the periphery of the coin shall consist of 18 groups of 3 dots (each group representing the 3 atolls of Tokelau). Between the border pattern and the top of the effigy shall appear the expression "TOKELAU • 1993":
- (b) For the reverse impression, the effigies of 2 men swimming, with a lane divider between the effigies, and an islet in the background. The expressions "OLYMPIC GAMES 1996" and "\$5 • LIMA TALA" shall appear around the periphery of the coin, with the expression "OLYMPIC GAMES 1996" being above the effigies, and the expression "\$5 • LIMA TALA" being below the effigies.

Composition, Weight, Diameter, and Edge Treatment

21. Composition—(1) The fifty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall be made of pure silver 999/1000.

(2) The twenty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall be made of cupro-nickel.

(3) The five dollar coins authorised by regulations 15 to 20 of these regulations shall be made of 925 fine silver.

22. Weight—(1) The fifty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall weigh 31.103 grammes (1 troy ounce), except that in the making of the coins a tolerance (in excess or deficiency) of 0.3 grammes shall be allowed.

(2) The twenty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall weigh 28.28 grammes, except that in the making of the coins a tolerance (in excess or deficiency) of 0.3 grammes shall be allowed.

(3) The five dollar coins authorised by regulations 15 to 20 of these regulations shall weigh 31.47 grammes, except that in the making of the coins a tolerance (in excess or deficiency) of 3 percent shall be allowed.

23. Diameter—(1) The fifty dollar and twenty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall be circular with a diameter of 38.6 millimetres, except that in the making of the coins a tolerance (in excess or deficiency) of 0.05 millimetres shall be allowed.

(2) The five dollar coins authorised by regulations 15 to 20 of these regulations shall be circular with a diameter of 38.6 millimetres, except that in the making of the coins the following tolerances shall be allowed:

- (a) In excess, 0.1 millimetres:
- (b) In deficiency, 0.05 millimetres.

24. Edging—(1) The fifty dollar and twenty dollar coins authorised by regulations 2 to 14 of these regulations shall have a milled edge.

(2) The five dollar coins authorised by regulations 15 to 20 of these regulations shall have a reeded edge.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the designs for a number of commemorative coins to be made and issued by the Administrator of Tokelau. The coins are to be legal tender only in Tokelau.

The obverse impression on all the coins provided for in these regulations uses the Makloun design for the effigy of Her Majesty the Queen. The reverse impressions (other than those of the twenty dollar coins) are illustrated below.
