### Order

- 1 Title**  
This order is the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Special Exemptions Extension) Order 2004.
- 2 Commencement**  
This order comes into force on 1 May 2004.

**3 Extension of special exemptions**

The exemption period referred to in sections 81 and 82(1) of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997 is extended for a period of 12 months, from the beginning of 1 May 2004 to the close of 30 April 2005, in relation to the laws, and the provisions of the laws, specified or described in Schedule 3 of that Act.

**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order comes into force on 1 May 2004. The order extends, for 12 months, the exemptions of certain laws from the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997. The exemptions would otherwise expire on the close of 30 April 2004. The extension applies to the laws set out in Schedule 3 of that Act.
