- 1 Title**
This order is the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (Special Exemptions Extension) Order 2005.
- 2 Commencement**
This order comes into force on 1 May 2005.

3 Extension of special exemptions

The exemption period referred to in sections 81 and 82(1) of the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997 is extended for a period of 12 months, from the beginning of 1 May 2005 to the close of 30 April 2006, in relation to the laws, and the provisions of the laws, specified or described in Schedule 3 of that Act.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order comes into force on 1 May 2005. The order extends for 12 months the exemptions of certain laws from the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997. The laws are listed in Schedule 3 of the Act. The exemptions would otherwise expire on the close of 30 April 2005.
