

THE TROUT-FISHING (ASHBURTON) REGULATIONS. 1941, AMENDMENT NO. 3

At the Government House at Wellington, this 29th day of August, 1945

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Trout-fishing (Ashburton) Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Trout-fishing (Ashburton) Regulations 1941* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October, 1945.

4. Regulations 17 and 18 of the principal regulations are revoked, and the following regulation substituted :---

"17. No person shall take, attempt to take, or kill any trout or other acclimatized fish by any means other than by fishing in a lawful manner with artificial bait—

"(a) In the Ashburton River from its source to the point known as Cole's Cutting (approximately 10 miles below the main South Road Bridge and approximately 13 miles from its mouth):

"(b) In the tributaries of the Ashburton River :

Provided that it shall be lawful to use bait other than artificial bait in the tributary of the Ashburton River known as the Lagmhor Creek."
