THE TELEGRAPH REGULATIONS 1963, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of February 1964

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Regulations 1963, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Telegraph Regulations 1963* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 17, and substituting the following regulation:

“17. (1) Photographs, pictures, drawings, or typed, printed, or hand-written matter may be handed in for transmission as a phototelegram between public phototelegram stations under the control of the Minister. A facsimile reproduction of the article will be delivered to the addressee. The charges for inland phototelegrams shall be:

“(2) Phototelegrams may also be handed in for transmission from certain public stations to a privately owned phototelegram station or they may be transmitted from a privately owned station to certain public stations. The charges for this service shall be:

Size of Phototelegram	£	s.	d.
Not exceeding 7 in. × 5 in.	1	15	0
Exceeding 7 in. × 5 in. but not exceeding 9 in. × 7 in.	2	0	0
Exceeding 9 in. × 7 in. but not exceeding 10 in. × 9 in.	2	5	0

“(3) Except in the case of phototelegrams transmitted from a privately owned station to a public station for delivery therefrom, the services referred to in regulations 18 and 19 hereof shall not apply to phototelegrams exchanged between public and private stations.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for the furnishing of phototelegram service between privately owned stations and certain public stations and prescribe charges relating to the service.
