**THE WORLD METEOROLOGICAL ORGANISATION NAME
AND EMBLEM NOTICE 1959**

COBHAM, Governor-General

PURSUANT to the Police Offences Act 1927 and section 38 of the Statutes Amendment Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General hereby gives notice as follows.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the World Meteorological Organisation Name and Emblem Notice 1959.
2. No person shall use in connection with any trade or business—
 - (a) The name of the World Meteorological Organisation (a specialised agency brought into relationship with the United Nations in pursuance of Article 57 of the Charter of the United Nations); or
 - (b) The official emblem of the World Meteorological Organisation, the design whereof is reproduced in the Schedule to this notice; or
 - (c) Any other name, word, seal, emblem, or device having reference in any way to the World Meteorological Organisation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the notice, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice makes it an offence under Part I of the Police Offences Act 1927 to use in connection with any trade or business the name or official emblem of the World Meteorological Organisation or any other name, word, seal, emblem, or device having reference in any way to the Organisation. Under subsection (4) of section 38 of the Statutes Amendment Act 1948 every person who acts in contravention of this notice is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £10.
