### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 24th day of September 1990

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the War Pensions Act 1954, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 31, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the War Pensions Regulations 1956\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1990.

**2. Increasing amounts of motor vehicle loans**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Eighth Schedule (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 30), and substituting the Eighth Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The War Pensions Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 30 are hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations increase, on and after 1 October 1990, the maximum amounts of loan available for the purchase of motor vehicles. The maximum amount of loan available for double amputees and paraplegics is increased from \$10,972 to \$11,806. The maximum amount of loan available for war pensioners with a permanent locomotive disability is increased from \$4,938 to \$5,313.
