**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this  
6th day of April, 1951

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Safety Conservation Act, 1932, there being a Proclamation of Emergency now in force under that Act, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the Waterfront Strike Emergency Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Waterfront Strike Emergency Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

**2.** Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in the definition of the term "declared strike" in subclause (1), after the words "declared by", the words "these regulations or by".

**3.** The discontinuance of employment now existing in the waterfront industry is hereby declared to be a strike to which the principal regulations apply.
