(10.) CANTERBURY CARPENTERS.

Board of Conciliation, Canterbury District.—In the matter of “The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1894,” and the Acts amending the same; and in the matter of a dispute between the Canterbury Carpenters and Joiners’ Association (hereinafter called “the said Association”) and Williams and Stephens and James Goss (hereinafter called “the said firms”).

The Board, having taken into consideration the above dispute, recommend as follows:—

That the conditions of employment between the said firms and their workmen shall be those awarded by the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand in the matter of a dispute between the said association and the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners and the Christchurch Builders' Association, dated the 13th day of July, 1897, and filed in Court the 17th day of July, 1897.

That the said conditions shall remain in force up to and inclusive of the 5th day of July, 1899.
