(3.) Dunedin Seamen.

Before the Board of Conciliation, in the Otago and Southland Industrial District.—In the matter of an industrial dispute between the Dunedin Branch of the Federated Seamen's Industrial Union of Workmen and Mr. Keith Ramsay, shipowner, of Dunedin.

The Board has unanimously recommended the parties to accept the following terms as a settlement of the dispute:—

1. Wages to be increased by 10s. per month as from the 1st

March, 1897.

2. Overtime rates to remain as at present.

3. Holidays and payment for holidays to remain as at present.

4. Mr. Ramsay to have the same right of employing non-members of the union as at present, but to afford to members of the union the same right of employment as to others.

5. The Seamen's Union representative not to visit members on board ship, but Mr. Ramsay recognises the right of such representa-

tive to visit the men in their own time at any other place.

6. The foregoing terms to be embodied in an industrial agreement to remain in force for two years.
