

(6.) DUNEDIN BOOTMAKERS.

THIS agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1894," this 20th day of October, 1897, between the Dunedin Operative Bootmakers' Industrial Union of Workers and the undersigned boot-manufacturers to observe and carry out the general rules, conditions of labour, employment of apprentices, and to pay the prices, and to observe, conform to, and carry out all matters set forth in the statement of wages and conditions of labour attached hereto and marked "A."

This agreement to remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1897.
