#### APPRENTICES.

Apprentices to receive 2s. 6d. per week for the first six months, with a graduated rise of 2s. 6d. per week each following six months until the expiry of the term of apprenticeship, and afterwards to receive at the same proportion of wages until obtaining the minimum rate.

One apprentice to every five operatives fully employed.

*Time of Apprentices.*—Coat-making, two years; vest-making, one year; trouser-making, one year; trouser-finishing, six months; coat-machining, two years; vest-machining, one year; trouser-machining, one year; mole-machining, six months.

*Note.*—All work to be given out fully trimmed, and all material to be provided by the employer.

Prices for any class of work not provided for in this log shall be arranged provisionally by the manufacturer and the employes concerned, and afterwards ratified by the committee of the union.

Tweed and mole trousers and knickers made by power machines, 2d. per dozen less.

Union hands to have preference of employment.
