

(27.) AUCKLAND COMPOSITORS.

THE Auckland Typographical Association, being a party to the dispute hereinafter mentioned, doth hereby complain to the Court of Arbitration that Arthur Cleave, of Auckland, printer, trading as "A. Cleave and Co.," on the 12th day of May, 1900, there then being an industrial dispute within the meaning of "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1894," and such dispute having been referred under section 46 thereof to the said Court of Arbitration constituted by and under the said Act, and the said Arthur Cleave, being an employer and a party to the proceedings in such dispute before the said Court, did on account of such industrial dispute, and not for any other good cause, cease to continue to employ W. P. McGowan, H. W. Meredith, and W. E. Smithyman, who were employés of the said Arthur Cleave at the time such dispute was referred to the said Court, until the Court should have come to a final decision on such dispute in accordance with the said Act, contrary to the provisions of section 29 of the said Act.

McGowan, H. W. Meredith, and W. E. Smithyman as shall desire to be so taken in the same capacities as they respectively occupied at the time of their dismissal; and do further pray that the said Arthur Cleave be ordered to pay to the Auckland Typographical Association such costs and expenses of the proceedings herein as to the Court of Arbitration shall seem fit.
