## STATEMENT.

1. The hours of work to be not more than forty-seven per week.

2. Apprentices to be paid for the first six months 5s. per week, second six months 7s. 6d. per week, or, if desired by employer, piecework.

3. All workers who have served twelve months at the trade to be paid not

less than £1 per week, or piecework.

4. Teachers to be paid 10s. for each apprentice in addition to labour of such

apprentice for one month.

- -5. Members of the Otago Box-workers' Industrial Union of Workers to be employed in preference to non-members, provided there are members equally qualified with non-members to perform the work required to be done.

  6. Cloth-work, sample-cases, &c., to be paid for at the rate of 7d. per hour.
- 7. Unclassified or special work to be paid for at the rate of 6d. per hour. 8. This agreement to remain in force from the 1st day of July, 1901, till the 31st day of December, 1901, or until a fresh agreement is entered into.
