SIR,—

The Board's recommendation is as follows :—

That the award of the Arbitration Court on the 27th May, 1903, be adopted, with the following alterations: that country bakers should start work at 3 a.m. instead of 4 a.m.; also that in clause 9 the permission of the union may be granted to employee to board and lodge with employer in the country district, where it is difficult for employee to obtain lodgings.

If this recommendation is not objected to on or before the 1st day of January, 1904, it shall come into force, and remain in force until the 27th day of May, 1905.
