

(719.) AUCKLAND TAILORESSES.—AGREEMENT.

THIS agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1894," and amendments thereof, this 29th day of April, 1904, between the Auckland Clothing-manufacturers' Union (hereinafter called "the employers") of the one part, and the Auckland Tailoresses' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the union") of the other part.

Whereas an industrial dispute has arisen within the meaning of "The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1894," and amendments, and such industrial dispute was referred for settlement to the employers on the one part and the union on the other part: And whereas terms of settlement were agreed upon between the parties and approved, and such terms of settlement are as hereafter appears: Now this agreement witnesseth—

1. That the log filed in the Supreme Court at Auckland on the 11th April, 1902, as altered and added to by the award of the Arbitration Court on the 9th day of May, 1903, be continued in force for two years—viz., to expire on the 11th April, 1906—with the following conditions:—

2. This agreement shall be an industrial agreement within the meaning of the said Act.

3. This agreement shall operate and take effect from the 11th day of April, 1904, and shall continue until the 11th day of April, 1906.
